Greetings everyone. One of the new additions we added to our "Call Box" is a little bio from a different member each month. This month it is my turn. So, a little about me....

I was born in Queens, NY but I grew up in Valley Stream. Back in the 60's, 70's and 80's, Valley Stream was a great place to live and grow up. I attended Valley Stream South High School and then went off to be an auto mechanic. In 1979, I joined the Valley Stream Fire Department. That is where I first met our president, Joe Berardi. A very long time ago. He was in Engine one and I was in Engine 3. I rose to Captain, while Joe continued his journey up to Chief. I met a lot of great guys in the fire department. A lot were cops and fireman from FDNY. I started taking all the test I could take.

In January of 1985, I was appointed to the NYC Transit Police. Not where I wanted to go, but I took what I was dealt with. I was on the tri agency list and was drafted to Transit. As it turned out, Transit was a great job. Upon graduating, I was assigned to TPF in District 33 ENY. I worked 8P's with 2 hours of mandatory OT every night. I remember my first night on patrol. Here I am, a 24-year-old KID from Long Island thrown out to the wolves all by myself on the "L" train in East New York. I think I may have been on a subway only once in my life prior to this day. After TPF, I was lucky enough to get into plain clothes task force. That is where I first met our fellow lodge member Dianna Pennetti. She was sergeant back then. I worked there until 1988 at which time I was appointed to detective. At the end of my Transit Career, I worked in the Major Case Squad where I worked with then Captain Carol Burke, another one of our lodge members. She continued to rise through the ranks after the merge.

One of my childhood dreams was to be a Nassau County Police Officer. I never thought it would happen because I didn't have the required college credits. Luckily for me, my good friend John O'Moore never stopped haunting me to go back to school. John and I went on Transit together. A short time later, he rolled over to the street, and then went on to Nassau County ahead of me in 1987. So, while working in the Major Case Squad, I started taking classes at CW Post on Long Island. It was the best thing I ever did. I got my credits and in July of 1993 I was appointed to the Nassau County Police Department. My childhood dream finally came true.

Upon graduating the academy, yes, I had to go through the academy all over again, I was assigned to patrol in the 4<sup>th</sup> pct. Eventually I was assigned a steady post in Inwood, car 409. I would stay there for the next seven years until I made detective. I always wanted to go back to the "Squad". I already had a taste of it in Transit (5 ½ years) and I couldn't wait to go back. Being a detective is in my blood. I loved it!!! Once I was appointed, I was assigned to the first Squad in Baldwin. A very busy place. I worked on everything from petit larceny to homicide. A lot of homicides. Not like 75 Pct. numbers, but for Nassau County, we had a lot. That was my favorite case to work.

In January of 2017, I decided to pull the pin after 32 years of service. I didn't think I would ever retire, I loved the job, but just around years 30-31, I started to get burnt out and I knew it was time to go. In February of 2017 I moved to south Florida. Another dream of mine. My kids had already been here for more than 15 years, and I couldn't wait to get here myself. I haven't looked back once. I love it!!!

So, in 2017, I retired, moved to Florida, bought a house, went through a hurricane, and got married to my best friend LeeAnn. Some of you see her serving the food at our meetings. I also reconnected with an old friend, President Joe Berardi. Joe and I have known each other for over 40 years now and I talk to him just about every single day. I think I talk to Joe more than I talk to my wife. LOL. Several years ago, Joe recruited to come on the board. I spent several years as the lodge's secretary. Today, I am now the 1<sup>st</sup> Vice President working alongside Joe. Together, we want to build on an already great lodge and make it bigger and better than ever.

## Video: NYPD Officer Bashed with Bottle in Unprovoked Attack

Security camera footage captured an assailant striking an NYPD officer with a bottle before punching her repeatedly in an unprovoked attack

An NYPD cop was bashed in the head with a bottle and then pummeled in an unprovoked attack from a stranger on a Bronx street, wild surveillance video shows.

The victim and her NYPD partner were standing in front of All Car Service on 231st St. in Kingsbridge when the attacker, wearing blue jeans and a hoodie, approached just before 2 p.m. Monday, the video obtained by the Daily News shows.

Police sources say the pair of cops were conducting inspections of illegal smoke shops,

Suddenly the attacker pulled a bottle out of his pocket and unprovoked whacked the female officer in the back of her head, the video shows.

The assailant continued his attack, grabbing the victim's long black hair and then delivering a few roundhouse punches to her face and body.

Her partner absorbed some of the blows as her started to wrestle with the assailant. Two other men, who sources say are New York City Sheriff's officers working with the NYPD, joined in and tried to ward off the attacker, the recording shows.

As the three men were busy trying to subdue the assailant, the battered victim ran between two parked cars and then turned back to watch her partner wrestling with the man. She is assigned to the 114th Precinct in Queens but was detailed to a special unit for investigating smoke shops, sources said.

The assailant, Jose Garcia, 45, was arrested and charged with assault, obstruction of government administration, resisting arrest, menacing, weapon possession and harassment.

The attacked officer was taken to St. Barnabas Hospital, where she was expected to recover.

Garcia's arraignment was pending In Bronx Criminal Court Tuesday.




