Introduction to NYPD
By Roger A. Gross, US Park Police, Retired

I started my career as a U. S. Park Police officer in the Gateway National Recreation Area. Parts of this new park were in Brooklyn, Queens and Staten Island, most transferred by New York City to the Federal Government. The National Park Service managed the lands and the Park Police handled urban policing.

I was supposed to be on NYPD. I took the written exam and scored a 99. My number on the list was 9070. I also took the physical at the Brooklyn Navy Yard. Then the notice came in the mail saying New York City was going to be bankrupt. My number was pushed back to 16,070 as New York City laid off 7000 police officers and many other municipal employees.

I was graduating college and getting married in the summer of 1976. I took the first job that called me, the U. S. Park Police. With its origins dating back to 1791, the Park Police is one of the oldest federal police agencies in the United States.

The Park Police headquarters in New York was on Floyd Bennett Field. I arrived back in New York in the beginning of June of 1976 after federal police training in Brunswick, Georgia.

Our neighbors on Floyd Bennett Field were the Aviation Unit, Emergency Services Unit and the U. S. Coast Guard Helicopter Unit.

The Park Police even had a range in one of the hangars. Aviation and ESU personnel were invited for our annual turkey shoot each November.

One of my first days out on solo patrol, I got a call to respond to the base of the Marine Park Bridge on the Queens side. I was to meet the Coast Guard personnel out of Fort Tilden, Rockaway. They had recovered a dead body. In Jamaica Bay. The area was in the confines of the 100th precinct. By the time I got there, the Coast Guard had unloaded the body and put it on the ground.

Mind you, I am a rookie, doing solo patrol just after finishing Field Training. This was my first big assignment of any significance.

I looked at the bloated body of a male. I saw there was a paper bag over its head. The body was hogtied with electrical wire and weighed down with a motor from an air conditioner compressor.

I was staring at the body and taking notes as two NYPD detectives walked down to the scene. Both were drinking coffee in the white and blue paper cups from the Rams Horn Diner on Beach Channel Drive.

I greeted the two detectives and advised them I was assigned to write the report for the dead body for our department.

They looked at me and they figured correctly that I was a rookie. One asked, "What do you think kid?" I said, "I have no idea!" I was still looking at a hog tied body with the bag over the head thinking WTF!

One of the detectives actually looked like former police officer and actor, Dennis Farina. He walked up close to the DB, squatted down, paused and said, "Obvious suicide, you don't see it?"

I laughed out loud as did his partner and the Coast Guard guys. That was my introduction to working with NYPD in New York. I have no clue to this day who the guy was but it turned out there were two small bullet holes in his head through the paper bag and there was a couple of 100 dollar bills in his pocket. This is the first time I have written this story as part of the short stories of my life.






