














Congratulations

NYC Medicare Retirees Part B Reimbursement and IRMA

(Click on Above Link)

Questions about your IRMAA or Medicare Part B Reimbursements? Medicare Part B 2021 Reimbursement. Medicare-eligible retirees and their Medicare-eligible dependents will be reimbursed annually for the standard Medicare Part B amount of \$148.50 per month ($$148.50 \times 12 \text{ months} = $1,782$), excluding any penalties and late enrollment fees, and subject to be pro-rated.

IRMAA 2021 Reimbursement

IRMAA 2021 annual reimbursements will be issued in October 2022.

Medicare-eligible retirees and their Medicare-eligible dependents can submit an IRMAA application if they paid above the standard amount of \$148.50 per month. If you did not pay more than the standard amount then you are not eligible for IRMAA.

- If you are currently receiving your pension check through Electronic Fund Transfer (EFT)
 or direct deposit, your reimbursement will be deposited directly into your bank account.
 This is separate from your pension payment. If you don't have EFT or direct deposit, you
 should receive a check in the mail.
- IRMAA 2021 Reimbursement Application will be available in May 2022

Please be Advised that that the appeal of Judge Lyle Frank's Ruling between the City of New York and NYC Organization of Public Service Retirees will not be heard until September which means everything should stay status quo until then. One should be able to use the Once in a Lifetime option to go into any availabe health plan that the City Offers. There is a possibility that the City may try to Cancel all plans other than the NYC Medicare Advantage Plus Plan.

Medicare Enrollment/Disenrollment

The Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services is providing equitable relief to individuals who could not submit premium-Part A or Part B enrollment or disenrollment requests timely due to challenges contacting us by phone. This relief applies to the 2022 General Enrollment Period, Initial Enrollment Period, and Special Enrollment Period.

If you were unable to enroll or disenroll in Medicare because you could not reach us by phone after January 1, 2022, you will be granted additional time, through December 30, 2022.

Avoid Scams When Donating to Disaster Relief:

Following disasters, consumers can avoid scams by donating to recovery and relief efforts through registered charities. The Florida Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services (FDACS) is the regulatory agency for charities in the state of Florida.

Consumers can confirm the legitimacy of a charity through the department's Check-A-Charity tool, which is one of several resources available to find additional information on charitable organizations in Florida. Consumers can also call 1-800-HELP-FLA or 1-800-FL-AYUDA, en Español, or visit FloridaConsumerHelp.com.

Here are tips to avoid scam charities:

Check if the organization is properly registered with the state: In addition to checking the organization on our Check-a-Charity tool, consumers can reference the Better Business Bureau's Wise Giving Alliance, which evaluates charities against comprehensive Standards for Charity Accountability to help donors make informed giving decisions.

Ask how exactly your donation will be used, what specific cause it will go towards, and how much of the contribution will be used for program services: Consumers should not assume their donation will be spent a particular way. If you are solicited for a contribution, ask to see written information about the organization, and a breakdown of how the money is being utilized.

Ask if your donation is tax deductible: Although many organizations are tax-exempt and contributions to their causes are tax-deductible, not every organization that solicits contributions is tax-deductible. Ask for the organization's tax-exempt number issued by the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) or use the IRS Tax Exempt Organization Search tool.

The Cops are Doing Their Jobs - Other Parts of Criminal Justice System Result in Catch and Release of Criminals

April 25, 2022

Dear Lieutenant:

It is blatantly obvious that the men and women of the New York City Police Department are doing their job to fight crime. They are out on the streets, putting their lives on the line, to remove illegal guns from violent criminals in an effort to reduce deaths associated with gun violence. It has also become abundantly clear that the men and women of the NYPD are the only people in the criminal justice system conscientiously and effectively fulfilling their duty to protect the people of New York.

Other portions of the criminal justice system, specifically most District Attorneys and many judges, have more empathy for the criminal then the victim. This concern routinely results in an expeditious judicial release of violent criminals who inevitably return to the streets to victimize others. It is incredible how the District Attorneys and judges are not held accountable for their criminal advocacy.

I will repeat, ad nauseum, that the state legislature must listen to the people of New York and repeal the broken Bail Reform Bill. The Bail Reform Bill does not create equality in the criminal justice system, it only creates more crime, more victims, more shootings, and more murders.

The officers of the NYPD are responsible to **enforce the law and arrest** those who break the law. Our members do this daily. Sometimes they sacrifice their lives in performing their sworn duty. The District Attorneys and judges are responsible for **prosecuting and detaining criminals**. This is where the criminal justice system is breaking down. The reason for this is due to District Attorneys who refuse to prosecute, judges who refuse to detain violent criminals, and the criminal friendly NYS State Legislators who passed Bail Reform.


This contrary and conflicted criminal justice system ultimately results in the "Catch & Release" of violent criminals. These criminals bear no accountability for their anti-social actions and pay no penalty, all to the detriment of the law-abiding citizenry. The police do their job to "Catch" the criminals but the District Attorneys, judges and the criminal advocacy legislation of the NYS Legislature result in the "Release" of violent criminals.

We recently sent a <u>communication to Commissioner Sewell</u> requesting that the following information be provide to the LBA:

- How many total individuals were arrested during riots of 2020 and how many of these individuals were **prosecuted** and **convicted** for the crimes for which they were arrested.
- Of the over 4,431 gun arrests made by members of the department in the year 2021, how many of the people arrested were prosecuted and convicted of illegally possessing a weapon – firearm?

How can we, in good conscience, ask our members to jeopardize their lives to remove illegal guns off the streets if there are no criminal repercussions or consequences for the criminal(s)?

As soon as we hear back from the Commissioner, we will let the membership know what her response was to this request.

Vittoria Renzullo Rest in Peace

Vittoria Renzullo, age 89, of Yonkers died Friday, May 13, 2022. Vittoria Renzullo was born June 26,1932 in Bronx, NY to Italian immigrant parents (Sinibaldo and Giacomina (Santaniello) Renzullo) who came to New York in the early 1920's in search of a better life. She attended St. Martin of Tours Elementary School, Roosevelt High School and then Hunter College where she earned her Bachelor's and Master's Degrees in Sociology. She is on the Wall of Fame at Hunter for being one of their accomplished graduates. Vittoria also studied criminology and police science at John Jay College of Criminal Justice. Vittoria was fluent in English, Italian and Spanish and used these skills working for the Department of Social Services in NYC. In the mid 1950's she enrolled in the US Army and spent time in Japan, where she mastered the Japanese language, and achieve the rank of Specialist 3rd class.

Vittoria's father was a Carabiniere (state trooper) in Italy before coming to the US. Keeping the family tradition, she embarked upon what would ultimately be a successful and noteworthy career as a member of New York's Finest. She won the Frank J. Keeler Award for Academic Excellence from the New York City Police Academy for the highest academic average. She was the first woman to attend the FBI Academy and was given the J. Edgar Hoover Award, once again for attaining the academic average. She was promoted to lieutenant and captain, and in 1976 became the first woman to command a precinct in the NYPD. She successfully ran the 1st, 17th and 48th Precincts, coming full circle back to her neighborhood roots in the Bronx. Retiring with a rank of Deputy Inspector, Vittoria left the NYPD in 1983 to pursue Law and Medicine. She was accepted at Georgetown University but stayed local to be near her aging parents. Vittoria passed her bar exam in NY with such a high score that she had her choice of wavier of the bar exam in Washington DC. Her rigorous medical career included working in the AIDS clinic at St. Claire's Hospital and finally as a bilingual psychiatrist at St. Barnabas Hospital until her retirement in 2012.

A lover of animals, a true patriot and veteran, a champion for all underprivileged, Vittoria devoted her life to being a devout Catholic and has been a role model for all who knew her. She was a very humble and never sought accolades for all that she accomplished. When asked about her illustrious careers, Vittoria always responded that she considered herself a police officer at heart.

Passing of Former LBA President Tony Garvey

(Rest in Peace)

Today, Friday May 20th, our friend Tony Garvey passed away after a courageous battle against a persistent ailment.

Tony was a decorated combat veteran having served as a sergeant for an infantry squad in 1968, with the 9th Infantry Division, during the Vietnam conflict.

After serving in Vietnam, Tony was appointed to the New York City Police Department on June 25, 1973. Tony said he had "accidentally stumbled on becoming a cop." He had returned from Vietnam and was awaiting discharge at Fort Dix in New Jersey, when he took the police test in 1969 under Project Transition, which gave soldier test-takers leave for the rest of the weekend. "I didn't give it much thought," he said. "I took the test because it was there."

The department called him in 1973 and he became a Police Officer on June 25 of that year. He became a Sergeant in 1981, working various posts in The Bronx. In 1985 he was promoted to Lieutenant, working in a Neighborhood Stabilization Unit, a training program for new Police Academy graduates. In 1991, he successfully challenged incumbent LBA President Jim Gebhardt after a union contract that stretched the wait for top pay for Lieutenants from three years to five.

In his 16 years as the President of the LBA (the longest serving president of the Association) Tony represented more than 1,700 active and 2,500 retired Lieutenants at the collective bargaining table and as a Trustee to the New York City Police Pension Fund.

In 2007, Tony was appointed by then Police Commissioner Raymond Kelly, to serve as Executive Director of the Police Pension Fund (PPF). He was the second Executive Director, following Michael Welsome, since the Fund had been incorporated as a separate New York City Agency. As Executive Director, Tony oversaw the administration of the Police Pension Fund's more than 24 billion dollars in assets.

Tony had attended and successfully completed the certificate program from the Wharton School, at the University of Pennsylvania, in the Fundamentals of Money Management Program and had earned a Masters Degree from Cornell University and the Bernard Baruch College of the City of New York

Keep your personal information safe in the New Year




Protect your information by using or or updating "your security software" and "protect your personal information" to the mix. Scammers and hackers are always looking for new ways to steal your personal information online.

Here are some steps you can take to help protect yourself and your information:

- Keep your security software, internet browser, and operating system up to date. Updating your software regularly helps make sure you have critical patches and protections against security threats.
- Create and use strong passwords. Making a password longer 12 characters or more is one of
 the easiest ways to increase its strength. Consider using a passphrase of random words so that your
 password is more memorable, but avoid using common words or phrases. Check out this password
 checklist, and don't use the same password for different accounts.
- **Use multi-factor authentication.** Some accounts offer extra security by requiring two or more credentials to log in. You may have to give both a password and a passcode you get from an authentication app to log into your account. Multi-factor authentication makes it harder for scammers to log in to your accounts even if they manage to steal your username and password.
- Back up your data to protect it. Keep an extra copy of all your files with a secure cloud storage service, or save your files to an external storage device. That way, if something happens say a virus, your device crashes, or you're hacked you still have your files.
- Protect your home network. Your devices, accounts, and whole network are only as secure as your
 router, since it's the connecting point between your devices and the internet. Check out how to make your
 router more secure.

By taking a few steps, you'll be able to enjoy the feeling of accomplishment that comes with checking something off your list! Also, remember to report fraud, scams, or bad business practices to the FTC at ReportFraud.ftc.gov. And happy New Year from your friends at the FTC.
