













NYC Medicare Retirees Part B Reimbursement and IRMA

(Click on Above Link)

Questions about your IRMAA or Medicare Part B Reimbursements? Medicare Part B 2021 Reimbursement. Medicare-eligible retirees and their Medicare-eligible dependents will be reimbursed annually for the standard Medicare Part B amount of \$148.50 per month ($$148.50 \times 12 \text{ months} = $1,782$), excluding any penalties and late enrollment fees, and subject to be pro-rated.

IRMAA 2021 Reimbursement

IRMAA 2021 annual reimbursements will be issued in October 2022.

Medicare-eligible retirees and their Medicare-eligible dependents can submit an IRMAA application if they paid above the standard amount of \$148.50 per month. If you did not pay more than the standard amount then you are not eligible for IRMAA.

- If you are currently receiving your pension check through Electronic Fund Transfer (EFT) or direct deposit, your reimbursement will be deposited directly into your bank account. This is separate from your pension payment. If you don't have EFT or direct deposit, you should receive a check in the mail.
- IRMAA 2021 Reimbursement Application will be available in May 2022

One should be able to use the Once in a Lifetime option to go into any availabe health plan that the City Offers. There is a possibility that the City may try to Cancel all plans other than the NYC Medicare Advantage Plus Plan.

Avoid Scams When Donating to Disaster Relief:

Following disasters, consumers can avoid scams by donating to recovery and relief efforts through registered charities. The Florida Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services (FDACS) is the regulatory agency for charities in the state of Florida.

Consumers can confirm the legitimacy of a charity through the department's Check-A-Charity tool, which is one of several resources available to find additional information on charitable organizations in Florida. Consumers can also call 1-800-HELP-FLA or 1-800-FL-AYUDA, en Español, or visit FloridaConsumerHelp.com.

Here are tips to avoid scam charities:

Check if the organization is properly registered with the state: In addition to checking the organization on our Check-a-Charity tool, consumers can reference the Better Business Bureau's Wise Giving Alliance, which evaluates charities against comprehensive Standards for Charity Accountability to help donors make informed giving decisions.

Ask how exactly your donation will be used, what specific cause it will go towards, and how much of the contribution will be used for program services: Consumers should not assume their donation will be spent a particular way. If you are solicited for a contribution, ask to see written information about the organization, and a breakdown of how the money is being utilized.

Ask if your donation is tax deductible: Although many organizations are tax-exempt and contributions to their causes are tax-deductible, not every organization that solicits contributions is tax-deductible. Ask for the organization's tax-exempt number issued by the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) or use the IRS Tax Exempt Organization Search tool.

Amid rising crime rates, Mayor Eric Adams will sit down with NYPD commanding officers.

Mayor Eric Adams has called a meeting with the NYPD's commanding officers to solicit ideas about combatting soaring crime in the Big Apple ahead of the historically bloody summer month, The Post has learned.

Hizzoner is set to sit down with the COs Saturday afternoon in One Police Plaza — and he's asked them to each bring three plans to reduce crime in their patrol areas, according to sources.


Adams has also requested statistics on crime, summonses, homeless encampment clearings and Civilian Complaint Review Board cases, as well as information on each command's integrity control officer, the sources said.

The mayor confirmed the upcoming meeting during an interview with The Post's editorial board on Wednesday.

"I have a major meeting this weekend with all of my commanders," he said. "We're going to sit down for several hours to get our summer plan in order, as well as, think how we deploy police."

The planned sit-down is similar to the department's Compstat meeting in which COs are grilled on crime in their patrols areas.

But not everyone is taking it seriously. One source with knowledge of the meeting quipped that commanders think bringing ideas to combat crime is a "joke."

The gathering comes as Adams ends his fourth month in office with crime and gun violence still on the rise — after sailing to a mayoral victory campaigning on getting the bloodshed under control in Gotham.

Suspects walk free after arrests by NYPD's new anti-gun teams

Four men allegedly busted with weapons — including some that were loaded — by the <u>NYPD's new anti-gun unit</u> were allowed to walk free within hours of their arrest, thanks to lax judges and bail reform, The Post has learned.

The NYPD said the <u>new Neighborhood Safety Teams</u> made 25 gun arrests in their first three weeks since launching in March, but The Post was only able to obtain court records or information for 12 of the cases.

Of those 12, just one man remains behind bars — meaning 11 of the defendants are back on the street, including the four who were cut loose with no bail. The others had posted bail that was set in their respective cases.

One of the sprung includes Tyquise Bell, 23, who was allegedly nabbed by NST cops on March 30 in the Bronx after they spotted a 9mm Taurus pistol inside the lower leg of his pants, court records say.

"I found it for sure. Two days ago. I've only had it for two days," Bell allegedly told police during the bust, according to a criminal complaint.

During his arraignment the next day, the Bronx District Attorney's Office and Judge Srividya Pappachan, a former public defender and a Bill de Blasio appointee, agreed to spring him on supervised release because the charges weren't bail eligible, records show.

A day later in Brooklyn, two more NST arrestees were freed shortly after their arrests on gun charges.

Xayvion Rodgers, 19, was drinking out of a Casamigos tequila bottle around 1:30 a.m. in Bedford-Stuyvesant when an NST unit spotted a loaded 9mm pistol on him, court records say.

Rodgers took off running from the cops and dropped the gun, which his co-defendant Robert Griffin, 19, picked up and shoved into a plastic shopping bag, the records show.

Inside the bag was a loaded B6C Sarsilmaz pistol with one cartridge in the chamber and 12 cartridges in the magazine, court papers show.

The duo was charged with second-degree firearm possession, a felony charge for which bail can be set, but during their arraignment, Judge Phyllis Chu freed them both on supervised release, records show.

Prosecutors from the Brooklyn District Attorney's Office asked Chu, another de Blasio appointee, to hold Rodgers on a \$10,000 cash, \$20,000 bond or \$40,000 partially secured bond. But she declined.

When Griffin was arraigned, prosecutors consented to supervised release after seeing that his co-defendant had just been sprung by Chu, the DA's Office said.

Later that month, a Brooklyn judge sprung Marcos Malvar without bail following his March 26 bust by NST cops on felony firearm possession charges, according to court records.

Malvar, 21, was pulled over in a car that had drugs inside — and cops also turned up a loaded Hi Point Model CF .380 firearm, a semiautomatic weapon, with three rounds of ammo inside his bedroom dresser.

He was also charged with criminal obstruction of breathing for allegedly choking his girlfriend, the mother of his children, records show.

Assistant District Attorney Ari Rottenberg said during Malvar's arraignment on both cases that the offenses were bail eligible but "given the specific circumstances" of the matter, he recommended Judge Laura Johnson cut him loose on supervised release, according to a transcript of the proceeding.

Johnson ended up releasing Malvar on his own recognizance.

The Brooklyn DA's Office said that despite Rottenberg's statements in court that the charges were bail eligible, bail couldn't actually be set on the firearms count under state law.

Recent changes to the controversial bail guidelines that were passed in the state budget still wouldn't have allowed prosecutors to ask a judge to hold Malvar, the DA's office noted. Starting May 9, judges can only set bail for felony firearm possession charges if the defendant had previously been charged with having an illegal gun and is then found with one again.

The NSTs — a revamped version of the NYPD's controversial anti-crime unit <u>disbanded in 2020</u> and a key pillar to Mayor Eric Adams' fight to curb gun violence — launched in March in response to the city's surge in gun violence.

City Hall and the NYPD have so far given varying arrest data from the program's first three weeks. Most recently, on April 6, Chief of Department Ken Corey said the NSTs made 135 busts and that 67% of the suspects had a prior arrest record. Of the 25 gun arrests the NYPD said the teams have made, four of the suspects were juveniles, five had open felony cases and seven had been previously convicted of a crime.

Of the 135 total busts, which were for a range of offenses, 91 had prior arrest records, 57 had a prior arrest for a major felony and 21 were on parole or probation.

Of the dozen cases reviewed by The Post, Dwayne Davis, 44, was the only defendant to be held without bail after he allegedly shot someone multiple times on March 18 in the Bronx. He is charged him with attempted murder and felony firearm possession.

So far this year, shootings are up 10% across the city compared to the same period in 2021, with 354 reports of gunfire — a <u>rate of more than three shootings per day</u>.

The scourge has killed and maimed a host of innocent bystanders, including several children.

On April 8, 16-year-old Angellyh Yambo <u>was shot to death by a fellow teen just a block from her Bronx high school</u> and two other kids were injured after Jeremiah Ryan, 17, allegedly opened fire with a "ghost gun" during a dispute. On March 31, <u>12-year-old Kade Lewin was killed</u> when a stray bullet struck him in the head while he was sitting in a parked car with two relatives in Brooklyn. And on March 25, a 3-year-old girl was <u>hit while leaving her daycare</u> but miraculously survived.

Just days earlier, a 7-year-old girl <u>was grazed by a stray bullet</u> while standing with her mother at a Coney Island intersection and in January, a Bronx baby just days away from her first birthday <u>was shot in the face</u> while strapped

to a car seat in her mother's vehicle.

A Survival Guide for Visitors to the City of New York

The Cops are Doing Their Jobs - Other Parts of Criminal Justice System Result in Catch and Release of Criminals

April 25, 2022

Dear Lieutenant:

It is blatantly obvious that the men and women of the New York City Police Department are doing their job to fight crime. They are out on the streets, putting their lives on the line, to remove illegal guns from violent criminals in an effort to reduce deaths associated with gun violence. It has also become abundantly clear that the men and women of the NYPD are the only people in the criminal justice system conscientiously and effectively fulfilling their duty to protect the people of New York.

Other portions of the criminal justice system, specifically most District Attorneys and many judges, have more empathy for the criminal then the victim. This concern routinely results in an expeditious judicial release of violent criminals who inevitably return to the streets to victimize others. It is incredible how the District Attorneys and judges are not held accountable for their criminal advocacy.

I will repeat, ad nauseum, that the state legislature must listen to the people of New York and repeal the broken Bail Reform Bill. The Bail Reform Bill does not create equality in the criminal justice system, it only creates more crime, more victims, more shootings, and more murders.

The officers of the NYPD are responsible to **enforce the law and arrest** those who break the law. Our members do this daily. Sometimes they sacrifice their lives in performing their sworn duty. The District Attorneys and judges are responsible for **prosecuting and detaining criminals**. This is where the criminal justice system is breaking down. The reason for this is due to District Attorneys who refuse to prosecute, judges who refuse to detain violent criminals, and the criminal friendly NYS State Legislators who passed Bail Reform.

This contrary and conflicted criminal justice system ultimately results in the "Catch & Release" of violent criminals. These criminals bear no accountability for their anti-social actions and pay no penalty, all to the detriment of the law-abiding citizenry. The police do their job to "Catch" the criminals but the District Attorneys, judges and the criminal advocacy legislation of the NYS Legislature result in the "Release" of violent criminals.

We recently sent a <u>communication to Commissioner Sewell</u> requesting that the following information be provide to the LBA:

- How many total individuals were arrested during riots of 2020 and how many of these individuals were **prosecuted** and **convicted** for the crimes for which they were arrested.
- Of the over 4,431 gun arrests made by members of the department in the year 2021, how many of the people arrested were prosecuted and convicted of illegally possessing a weapon – firearm?

How can we, in good conscience, ask our members to jeopardize their lives to remove illegal guns off the streets if there are no criminal repercussions or consequences for the criminal(s)?

As soon as we hear back from the Commissioner, we will let the membership know what her response was to this request.





Protect your information by using or or updating "your security software" and "protect your personal information" to the mix. Scammers and hackers are always looking for new ways to steal your personal information online.

Here are some steps you can take to help protect yourself and your information:

- **Keep your security software, internet browser, and operating system up to date.** Updating your software regularly helps make sure you have critical patches and protections against security threats.
- Create and use strong passwords. Making a password longer 12 characters or more is one of
 the easiest ways to increase its strength. Consider using a passphrase of random words so that your
 password is more memorable, but avoid using common words or phrases. Check out this password
 checklist, and don't use the same password for different accounts.
- Use multi-factor authentication. Some accounts offer extra security by requiring two or more credentials to log in. You may have to give both a password and a passcode you get from an authentication app to log into your account. Multi-factor authentication makes it harder for scammers to log in to your accounts even if they manage to steal your username and password.
- Back up your data to protect it. Keep an extra copy of all your files with a secure cloud storage service, or save your files to an external storage device. That way, if something happens say a virus, your device crashes, or you're hacked you still have your files.
- Protect your home network. Your devices, accounts, and whole network are only as secure as your
 router, since it's the connecting point between your devices and the internet. Check out how to make your
 router more secure.

By taking a few steps, you'll be able to enjoy the feeling of accomplishment that comes with checking something off your list! Also, remember to report fraud, scams, or bad business practices to the FTC at ReportFraud.ftc.gov. And happy New Year from your friends at the FTC.




